**Long Range Planning Committee  
Goals/Strategies for 2010**

**Assumption:** The Long range Planning Committee (LRPC) is composed of a variety of organizations. As such each organization has their own individual goals for the coming year. The goals listed here are major efforts which the LRPC members agree to come together and support to further the overall strategy of reducing/eliminating homelessness.

1. Participate with the State of Utah in developing a training curriculum for case managers and housing property managers to ensure those serving special populations are provided with best practice information and skills to do their jobs.
2. Use HMIS data, Point in Time Count data, and information from other research to analyze service use to make decisions on the types of homeless programs and services needed.
3. Continue to plan for and develop affordable housing. Coordinate with other organizations to tap into funds available for housing.
4. Participate with the State of Utah in the development of an optimum homeless service delivery system that assesses those most in need of services, provides realistic services and evaluates outcomes of service provision.
5. Evaluate the effectiveness of the stimulus dollars made available for the acquisition, rehabilitation and construction of affordable housing, prevention and rapid re-housing services.
6. Coordinate more closely with the Salt Lake County Homeless Coordinating Council in the Continuum of Care (CoC) submittal and program operation to ensure that the objectives for the CoC are supported and realized. CoC goals include: the creation of affordable housing, increasing housing retention for the homeless, increasing the percentage of homeless persons moving from transitional to permanent housing, increasing the percentage of homeless persons that are employed, and decrease the number of homeless households with children.
7. Provide an update to LRPC members of the accomplishments and challenges of the County's Ten Year plan that was adopted in 2005.
